- **Planning Commission's 1993 Vision for 2015**
 - *We have...produced compact and livable communities surrounded by protected natural environments.*
 - *Our good neighborhoods are served by a balanced transportation system, efficient utilities, and neighborhood-oriented goods and services.*
 - *This vision has given us direction and motivation.*



Imagine 2040



- **Data will be used to update**
 - Long Range Transportation Plan
 - Comprehensive Plans
- **Change in focus**
 - More local control
 - Past: growth management
 - Future: economic development




Benefits of Concurrent Updates



- **Common horizon year simpler for general public**
- **Can use same data for all plans, saving costs**
- **Can partner on public outreach & input efforts**
- **Can address issues in a more comprehensive manner –**
 - Greater coordination between land use and transportation
 - Countywide approach to some major issues
- **Don't have to reinvent the wheel for approaches to:**
 - Streamlining the Comprehensive Plans
 - Addressing changes in state law

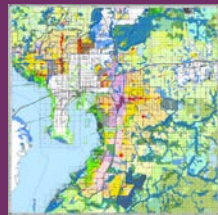
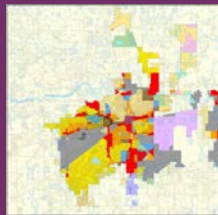



- Short-term
● **MPO Post-Referendum Study, 2012**
 - Alternative funding options
 - Best practices
 - Lower cost transit projects
 - Public opinion
 - Major concerns: economy, transportation, accountability
 - Approach to address concerns: incremental plan
 - Funding preference: local option gas tax and sales tax (0.5¢ countywide or 1¢ City of Tampa only)







Technical Staff Interviews



- *Promote Economic Development Areas, and include in the Urban Service Area.*
- *Implement the Economic Prosperity Stakeholder Committee recommendations.*
- *Implement the I-4 Green Tech Corridor recommendations.*
- *Define then market Tampa/Hillsborough's identity.*
- *Huge potential for development at I-4/I-75 interchange but land is not accessible.*
- *Promote Plant City as a hidden gem with land available.*



Technical Staff Interviews



- *Tie South County into Port Manatee.*
- *Concurrency didn't work.*
- *Of the next 10 buildings in Downtown Tampa, nearly all will be residential or entertainment.*
- *We haven't had a common vision last longer than 5 years.*
- *If you need a large employment site, go to Polk or Pasco County.*
- *Plant City needs to be known for more than just mobile home parks and Dinosaur World.*



Future Growth




- **Fundamental questions**
 - How much should we grow?
 - Where should that growth occur?
 - What should it look like?

1. Consume much of agricultural land
2. Reinvest in/redevelop cities and older suburbs
3. Move Urban Service Area Boundary significantly
4. Develop along I-4 and I-75
5. Create new "town" in Southeast County
