- Are we resilient to changes we can't control?

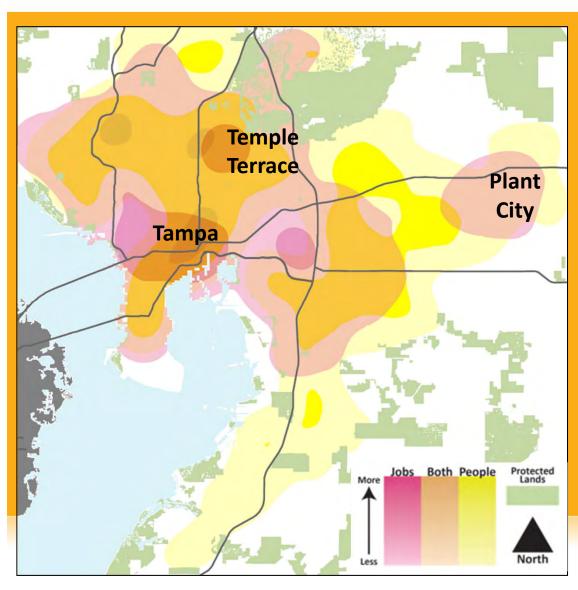

Hillsborough County Today





- 1.3 Million People
- 25% Agricultural Land
- 10% Environmental Preservation
- 87% of development inside growth boundary, last decade
- Bus service reaches ~ ½ of jobs, with limited hours
- Traffic is 6th worst in U.S.
- Worst pedestrian fatality rate in U.S.
- 25% drop in jobs, 2006-2011

What can we expect if we focus on business growth along major highways with express toll lanes?

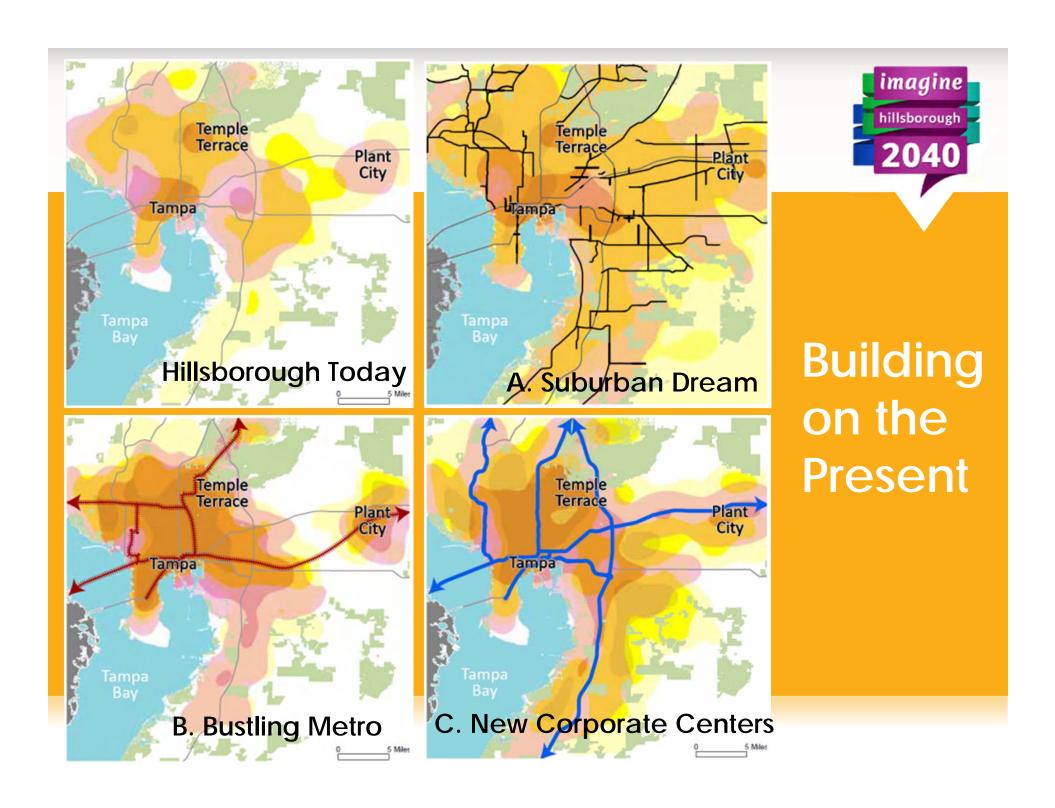






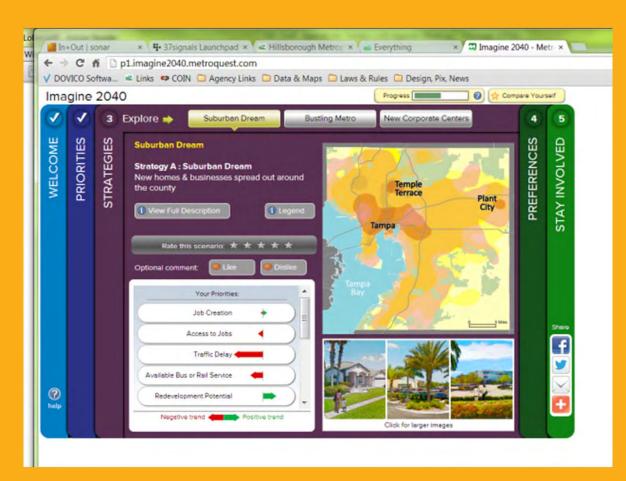
Create new corporate parks along major highways

Part of growing and attracting new businesses is having places ready for business growth.

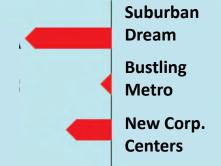


Suburban Dream Bustling Metro New Corp. Centers

Agriculture/Farming Impact Productive agricultural areas provide food, jobs, and benefits

to the local and regional economy.

Infrastructure Cost

Cost per person to expand infrastructure (like water, sewer, roads, and transit) can be reduced by concentrating houses and business in a particular area.





Redevelopment Potential

Reusing older properties may typically cost more for developers, but revitalizes communities.

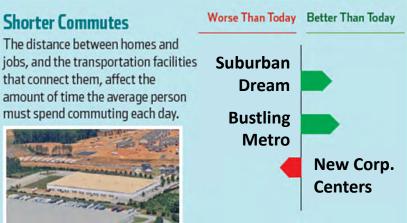

Available Bus or Rail Service

Public transit offers choices to access jobs, health care, and other activities for those who cannot or prefer not to drive.

Moderately priced housing may be a longer drive or bus ride from a living-wage jobs.







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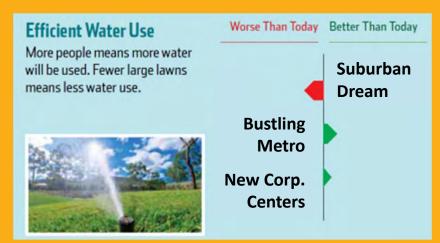


Efficient Energy Use

Building homes next to each other and close to destinations reduces fuel use.







Natural Resources

Wetlands and wildlife habitat provide water filtration, erosion control, recreational opportunities, healthy ecosystems, and other benefits.

Water Quality

Rain water picks up pollutants as it runs off impervious surfaces (like roofs and parking lots), draining into rivers, lakes, and drinking water reservoirs.

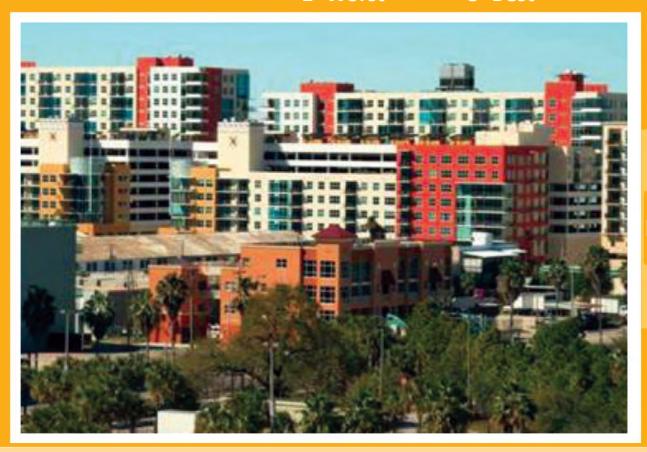
