The following questions were posed by attendees of the Gibsonton public meeting held on July 29, 2020. The questions are directly transcribed from the meeting. The answers have been provided by the Hillsborough County Economic Development staff.

Q: What resources are possible (being that Gibsonton is a lower socio-economic community) through County resources?

Currently, both resident and business R3 programs are available to Gibsonton through Dec 30, 2020. The programs cover financial assistance for businesses and individuals that were harmed due to the COVID-19 crisis, including: workforce training; financial assistance for small businesses economically injured by the COVID-19 crisis; payroll incentives to businesses that qualify; and a matching reimbursement for the workplace for improvements directly related to mitigating the spread of COVID-19. Q: What kind of plans and incentives that Gibsonton residents have for economic development activities?

Several County-wide programs are implemented and managed by the Economic Development Department that would assist business owners and entrepreneurs in the Gibsonton area.

- <u>Historic Preservation Challenge Grants</u>. The County financially supports, on a reimbursable basis, projects that promote historic preservation, heritage tourism and related business and economic development throughout the County.
