### From the MPO Director



2020 threw us a few curve balls, so to speak!

In response to COVID-19, our agency pivoted to a completely remote work schedule on March 17 to protect the health and safety of citizens and staff. The agency was able

to adapt so quickly thanks to an already established remote work policy and in-place technology. Public access to staff expertise and data continued seamlessly via phone and email, and public comments continued to be heard at all meetings of the MPO's Committees and Board.

Meanwhile, the work of the MPO did not skip a beat. Vision Zero, the vision of zero traffic deaths, shifted public engagement activities outdoors (for example, the Ride of Silence event, above) and deep-dove into data and audits of high-crash roads. The annual public hearing for the Transportation Improvement Program, along with smaller outreach meetings for studies like the Plant City Transit Plan, shifted to creative online platforms, announced by roadside signs, flyers in laundromats, direct mail, etc. The Independent Oversight Committee for the new transportation sales surtax approved by county voters in 2018 completed its first annual report and (virtual) public hearing. The MPO Board dug into the pluses and minuses of tolls on new express lanes, taking advantage of the online meeting environment to invite guest speakers from around the country. And the tri-county TMA Leadership Group, also meeting virtually, worked together to create a shared regional position statement on the drawbacks of state budget earmarks and the need for new transit funding.

Just a few of our notable successes this year:

- The international Institute of Transportation Engineers (ITE), Florida Section, chose the MPO's Speed Management Action Plan for its John W. Barr Transportation Achievement Award.
- The National Association of Development Organizations recognized our Resilient Tampa Bay project with an Excellence in Regional Transportation Award.

- The Florida MPO Advisory Council selected two of our projects for 2020's nine Noteworthy Practices: Resilient Tampa Bay, and our Tri-MPO Growth Scenarios and Survey, "It's Time Tampa Bay."
- Several of our staff were honored to speak at national conferences and webinars, including Gena Torres at the ITE Annual Meeting & Exhibition, Allison Yeh at a FHWA Resilience and Planning Peer Exchange, Johnny Wong as part of a FHWA Data Business Plan Development webinar, and Lisa Silva and myself at the 99th Annual Transportation Research Board meeting in Washington, D.C.

We're looking forward to seeing you in 2021, online if not in person! Thank you for being part of our shared journey towards a better community.

Rethinking How We Define The Problem



The MPO was honored to participate in the March 2020 Idea Hack-a-thon sponsored by Stantec. For two days, smart city professionals, entrepreneurs and students developed ideas for using technology, big data, and the internet of things to improve mobility and accessibility here in Tampa. Staff shared data sets and current practices with the competing teams, and Beth Alden served as a judge and advocated for the winning team's vehicle pollution monitoring and air filtering network.

The Lifesavers National Conference on Highway Safety Priorities, held virtually on June 2, 2020, featured Beth Alden as part of the opening keynote. Alden spoke alongside ITE Director/CEO Jeff Paniati and NYC DOT Assistant Commissioner Kim Wiley-Schwartz about implementing Vision Zero effectively, and shared lessons learned from established groundbreaking programs.



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Meet the MPO Board

The Hillsborough County Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) is responsible for short-term (5 years) and long-term (20+ years) transportation planning and priorities to meet the multi-modal needs of Tampa, Temple Terrace, Plant City and unincorporated Hillsborough County. Mandated by state and federal law, the MPO is accountable for ensuring that public transportation dollars

are wisely spent and reflect meaningful public engagement, and collaborative and comprehensive

### 2020 Project Highlights

In addition to key projects featured on the calendar pages, highlights here showcase more MPO projects from a busy and fulfilling year.

#### **Nondiscrimination Plan**

Throughout history, racial discrimination has been evident in transportation and land use planning. In Hillsborough County, neighborhood clearing created the path for I-275 and I-4, which ultimately divided African American communities and eliminated the Central Avenue Business District. After a wave of protests for racial justice in Spring 2020, MPO committee members and staff took a new



look at racial equity in local planning. A Racial Equity Resolution unanimously approved by the MPO Citizens Advisory Committee and the MPO Board in August 2020 acknowledges that planning decisions of the past have had negative consequences on communities of color, and resolves the agency to take action addressing those inequities.

This equity initiative coincides with the scheduled update of the MPO's Title VI and Nondiscrimination Plan. The plan is updated every three years to

demonstrate the MPO's compliance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act and other regulations. This update of the plan includes a history review of local planning, new demographic maps identifying the location of under-served communities, and public engagement including personal stories and focus groups.



Outgoing MPO Board Chair, Commissioner Lesley "Les" Miller, Jr. shared his own story of growing up in East Tampa, where decisions about highways, housing, bus service, urban disinvestment, and voting districts had great impact. The MPO thanks Commissioner Miller for his ten years of service on our board, and his commitment, hard work, and leadership! You will be missed, sir! The second phase of the **Garden Steps** project kicked off in January 2020 with a workshop dubbed "Making Stone Soup," in which the attendees each discussed what they can bring to the table to help expand access to fresh, healthy foods in Tampa's food deserts. The MPO was proud to receive a \$50,000 grant from the Aetna Foundation to support this work, which expands access through education, local agriculture, and walk/ bike connections. Later in the year, Garden Steps held the 3rd annual Grow Gardens conference for local networking and outreach, hired a student intern, and constructed a permanent educational/demonstration garden on 22nd Street in East Tampa (pictured).

#### **Smart Cities Mobility Plan**

#### The MPO's first Smart Cities Mobility Plan is

currently underway. Smart Cities technologies can improve safety on the network of roads and reduce congestion without the hefty price tag of more traditional improvements. The Plan will involve identifying and classifying mature and emergent technologies, such as real-time adjustment of traffic signals and detour information, speeding up buses, information sharing with Waze, and many other opportunities. We will be reaching out to the public to collect input about the usefulness of each technology and will be asking questions related to privacy, confidentiality, and fairness.

#### The MPO's Shared Data & Analytics Platform is a

web-based tool allowing transportation planners and engineers to visualize both real-time and historical traffic conditions on the road network. The platform initially included speed, congestion and weather data but has recently been enhanced to include crash, incident and pothole data. Future additions could eventually make the platform a one-stop-shop for mobility analytics. With all four local governments, HART and FDOT being able to use the platform, the MPO and its partners can better track progress

towards its performance targets for safety, good repair, and travel time reliability.

#### **Speed Management Action Plan**





#### Transportation Achievement Award

Speed is the number one factor in whether a person will survive a traffic crash or be involved in one. With the concerning number of people being hurt and killed on roadways in Hillsborough County, several approaches are needed to reduce injuries and deaths. This is why the Hillsborough MPO sponsored a study of speed management and safety, with recommendations like adding midblock crossings, coordinating signals that optimize an appropriate speed, installing roundabouts, and many other tools that help make roadways safe for people driving, walking, catching the bus, or bicycling.

The Action Plan identifies corridors that would benefit from speed reduction and includes recommendations for treatments to reduce driver's tendencies to speed.



It is also a call to action for setting safe speed limits, combined with education and enforcement, policy and legislation. The MPO Board approved the plan in July 2020.

Wasting no time, the FDOT cut the ribbon on four new, red-light-protected crosswalks on Busch Blvd in East Tampa and Temple Terrace (pictured) later in 2020.

#### **Public Participation Plan: Measures of Effectiveness**

Updated at least once every two years, our PPP Measures of Effectiveness report summarizes how we're doing at providing information, proactively seeking feedback, and using the feedback to shape community plans. During 2018-2019, over 4,000 people attended board and committee meetings, and we received over 5,000 responses to our It's TIME Hillsborough survey, which shaped the priorities for the 2045 Long Range Transportation Plan.

In the next two years, we plan to increase citizen engagement in historically underrepresented areas and create short videos to inform the public of activities taking place in our agency and let them know who we are. Recommendations from the report are incorporated into the Public Participation Plan (PPP), which describes the MPO's strategies and techniques to inform and engage the public and maximize participation and effectiveness.

#### **Regional Long Range Transportation Plan**




Because transportation doesn't stop at county lines, the MPOs and TPOs of West Central Florida, each of which represent hundreds of thousands of citizens from Brooksville to Sarasota and Clearwater to Winter Haven, meet regularly to coordinate plans and priorities. Known as the MPO Chairs Coordinating Committee (CCC), the chairpersons of these MPOs and TPOs convene 2-4 times per year, and their staff coordinates even more often.

Updated in 2020, the Regional Long Range

Transportation Plan is one of the CCC's key work products. It identifies transportation improvements that are significant to the region as a whole. The regional plan coincides and coordinates with Long Range Plan updates in each of the MPO/TPO areas.

Agencies in this region have committed to plan for, design, and construct the improvements in this Plan over the next two decades, supporting our shared vision. Like the Hillsborough MPO's other projects, this plan for regional collaboration can be found on the MPO website.

#### Linking Transit & Housing



Following up on a Plan Hillsborough strategic initiative to better connect land use and transportation, in 2020 an internal staff working group called Strategies for Transportation Alternatives and New Development Scenarios (STANDS) took a deep-dive into current and realistically available transit

service and affordable/attainable housing development opportunities.

With widespread interest in housing affordability during 2020, the group focused on how new multifamily housing could be better coordinated with existing bus routes (especially higher-frequency routes), access to jobs, and safe walk/bike connections. The group overlaid data from many different sources, coordinating with HART, Housing, Economic Development, the Planning Commission's 2045 growth forecasts and redevelopment potential maps, and the MPO's maps of crash clusters.

Several high-opportunity corridors have emerged, particularly in the USF area, the west side of Brandon, and the east side of Town & Country. Next steps include drafting policies to be considered by Hillsborough County and HART in their long-range plans, as an interagency shared strategic direction.





#### **Trips Without Borders**

A new grant from the Florida Commission for the Transportation Disadvantaged provided over 20,000 trips to individuals with intellectual disabilities during a 2019 pilot project with a tri-county service area. Providing on-demand trips across Hillsborough, Pinellas, and Manatee Counties, the pilot project operated by UZURV (above), an adaptive transportation network company, was funded under the Florida Legislature's new Advantage Ride grant program. In 2020, the Hillsborough MPO staff negotiated for another year of funding, coordinating with the County's Sunshine Line to ensure no duplication of service or state funding cuts to existing programs. The effort was successful! UZURV in collaboration with TBARTA received nearly \$1 million in new funding to provide inter-county and late-night trips to an even wider population of transportation disadvantaged people, such as MPO Livable Roadways Committee volunteer Arizona Jenkins (left).

Scheduled to open in 2021, the new lanes improve hurricane evacuation for almost 1.3 million local and regional families.

#### **Resilient Tampa Bay**

Made possible with a competitive grant from FHWA, the MPO's study of major roads vulnerable to flooding, across our tri-county area wrapped up in spring 2020. The study found that 19% of the Bay areas major roads are vulnerable to storm surge, heavy rain and sea level rise, and that essential roads, once washed out, could be impassible for days or weeks. Bolstering and protecting them is now part of the MPO's long range plan, as a result of the study. Later in the year, the project won a national award of excellence from NADO!

Resilience of another kind was on everyone's minds in spring 2020 as the COVID-19 pandemic surged. Tampa International Airport (right) and many other organizations swiftly implemented public health protocols to allow essential transport to continue.

#### The Countywide Vision of Zero Deaths

Eight of the top 20 severe-crash roads in our area are owned by Hillsborough County. In 2020, the MPO contracted with safety engineers to review all eight, with a goal of finding low-cost quick-fix projects the County can readily build. The roads range from urban 15<sup>th</sup> St (above) to suburban Sheldon Rd (left) to rural-fringe Mango Rd. Throughout, speed plays a huge role in the rate of death and serious injury. The County jumped in right away, starting with 15<sup>th</sup> St, where just three years ago the neighborhood used temporary paint and plastic flowers to highlight the need for improvements (far above) some of which have now been built! (near above)

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#### Town & Gown & Innovation

Even in the heart of the metro area there are little-used utility corridors that spark people's imaginations — like this one that parallels Fowler Ave, surprisingly right next to one of Florida's largest universities and a bustling medical district. Could it be the future location of a paved path for walking, cycling, even low-speed electric vehicles? In May 2020, at the urging of the City of Temple Terrace and the Innovation Partnership (!p), the MPO agreed to sponsor a study of a paved trail in this vicinity, running from the City's nearby neighborhoods to USF and west to the VA Hospital complex and University Square Mall redevelopment site. With the mall's transformation to a vibrant urban district ("Rithm at Uptown", pictured in inset) already underway, greenway connections are needed more than ever.

#### **Public Access to Decisions During a Pandemic**

On the evening of Tuesday, June 30, 2020, the MPO held its first-ever virtual public hearing, which was broadcast live on HTV (below), live-streamed on the internet, and provided phone-in access anyone who wished to speak. The hearing was on the annual update of the five-year Transportation Improvement Program (TIP).

Twenty-three citizens spoke, and 39 sent comments in advance, both for and against specific projects, especially projects on I-275 through the center of Tampa. After a lengthy debate and several motions to remove these projects, the MPO voted to approve the TIP as originally presented, with one amendment setting a higher priority on studying adding commuter rail service on existing less-used freight tracks.

One of the highlights of the TIP this year was a new \$55 million federal grant for Port Tampa Bay to improve their container shipping facilities (above). Transferring containers of goods from boats to rail, instead of onto trucks, reduces truck traffic on roads, as well as fuel consumption, since trains can move a ton of freight nearly 500 miles on one gallon of fuel.

#### **Bottleneck Relief**

In August 2020, after getting a jump-start on the Howard Frankland Bridge reconstruction when traffic dropped during the pandemic quarantine, the Florida Department of Transportation opened two new lanes (above) at the east end of the bridge. The project punched through a short pinch-point where I-275 narrowed from four lanes to two — a pinch-point that previously caused back-ups halfway to Pinellas County on a daily basis.

A much larger reconstruction of the Westshore District Interchange will get underway within the next five years. Early steps of FDOT's "Tampa Bay Next" program include new local street connections under I-275, to give people more ways to get around. Advanced traffic management systems, better transit service and bicycling routes for close-by commuters, and many other steps are being taken that raise the bar for interstate highway construction in Florida. To better absorb air pollution from vehicles, "green" noise walls with vines (like at the test site in Pasco County shown at left) are also in the toolkit for I-275 through Tampa, as a result of the MPO's 2020 White Paper on Environmentally Friendly Noisewall Design.




Excellence in Education

Following up on the collaborative planning of the MPO's silo-breaking School Transportation Workgroup, the County, City of Tampa and the School District celebrated several walk/bike safety improvements in 2020. At Sumner High in South Hillsborough County, a new school speed zone features pedestrian-activated crossing lights, blackout boxes that prevent right-hand turns when pedestrians are present, new crosswalk markings and stop bars (right). Meanwhile, Tampa's Mayor Jane Castor continued her Crosswalks to Classrooms program, inviting students, parents and even principals to join her in creatively painting crosswalks that get drivers' attention (above, pre-pandemic). At the end of the year, the MPO formally recognized the leadership of outgoing School Board and MPO member Cindy Stuart, who founded and chaired the School Transportation Workgroup.

#### **Connecting the Community**

Through most of 2020, the MPO worked on a plan for Plant City and HART, designing bus routes and estimating what they might cost. At residents' request, the routes included express routes to Tampa, Brandon and Lakeland, and circulator routes within Plant City linking neighborhoods and destinations like the community center (above). The service concepts and costs may be needed if and when the countywide Transportation Sales Surtax approved by voters in 2018 is upheld by the courts, providing some funds from Plant City business sales to HART.

Also in 2020, the FDOT redesigned part of US 92 through Plant City, to add landscape areas, crosswalks, and calm traffic (right), contributing to the walkability and livability of Downtown.
