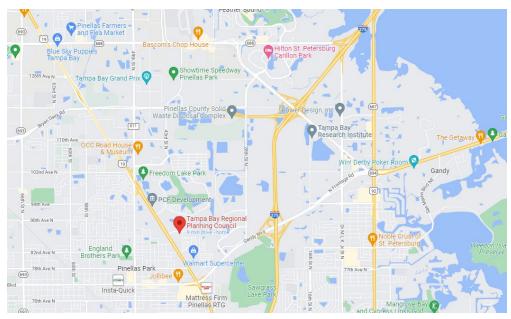

ENFORCEMENT OF SCHOOL ZONE SPEED LIMITS

Presenter:

SUMMARY:

Transportation safety continues to be a major issue facing the State of Florida and the Tampa Bay/greater Sun Coast region. In addition to engineering design for safer streets, both enforcement and education, including the use of available technologies, are important components of making our roadways safer. Speed enforcement is a key Vision Zero strategy that reduces dangerous driving behavior, serious injuries, and fatalities. Florida has lagged much of the nation in school zone safety, and the use of speed detection devices is a simple, effective, and inexpensive means of providing enforcement and education in school zones. The Florida Legislature again considered enabling cities and counties to install speed detection devices in school zones during the 2022 Legislative Session. SB 410 passed each of its committee stops before being placed on the calendar for full consideration, where it died for lack of a companion bill. HB 189 did not receive a hearing in any of its assigned committees.

For those bills to be re-introduced and gain support in the legislative process, additional local and regional support may be needed. Many of the MPOs comprising the Sun Coast Transportation Planning Alliance are leading Vision Zero efforts that would benefit from greater use of technology to reduce the risk of traffic violence to children and vulnerable road users.

Protecting Our Kids in School Safety Zones

SB 410 by Senator Rodriguez and HB 189 by Representative Duran

- Hundreds of thousands of Florida students cross roadways on their way to and from school and nowhere in America are they more in danger from cars than Florida.
- An exhaustive 2018 study by Zendrive found that Florida ranked 50th of all states in terms of unsafe driving in school zones.
- Twenty Florida counties both rural and urban received F grades for driving behavior in school safety zones.
- Pedestrian fatalities and injuries are preventable through enforcement of existing laws and education.
- This legislation gives communities a simple, effective, and inexpensive way to protect our students.
- The bill would allow communities to install school zone speed detection devices that deter vehicles from speeding through school zones. The speed detection systems would operate on school days, beginning one hour before school and ending one hour after school.
- No citations would be issued until a law officer first reviewed and confirmed the violation and there is an appeal process for anyone who believes they have been wrongfully cited.
- This is not a gotcha program. A county or municipality must spend at least 30 days educating the
 public about the new enforcement measures and issue only warnings before they are allowed to
 levy fines.
- Only the most egregious violators would be cited those going at least 11 miles above the speed limit and no points will be assessed against their license. Nor will insurance companies be notified.
- The difference in this year's bill compared to last year's legislation is in regards to the breakdown of the fine.
- Where the money goes:
 - o \$60 toward the state general fund
 - o \$84 toward local municipality and must be used for public safety
 - \$6 toward local school districts to be used for security initiatives and improving safety of student walking conditions
 - o \$4 toward FDLE Criminal Standards and Training Fund
 - \$4 toward the Coach Aaron Feis Guardian Program to train school security personnel
- The devices can also be a vital law enforcement tool for Amber Alerts.
- The program has been a big success in Georgia, including Thomasville and the Atlanta area, as well as other states.

Statistics

- 11 miles above the speed limit makes a huge difference for pedestrian safety. The Florida Department of Transportation says a driver going 35 mph only need 250 feet to stop for a pedestrian in a crosswalk, while a driver going 45 mph will travel an extra 110 feet in only half a second.
- A recent Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) study found 100% of people hit by an SUV at 40 mph died from the impact.
- The fatality rate of someone hit by a car at 20 mph is 10 percent, compared 40 percent at 40 mph and 90 percent at 58 mph, according to the AAA Foundation for Traffic Safety.

• The risk of severe injury for a pedestrian hit by a standard car at 16 mph is 10 percent, compared to 50 percent at 31 mph and 90 percent at 46 mph.

Support

- The Florida Police Chiefs Association (FPCA) and PTA supports the bill.
- The International Association of Chiefs of Police (IACP) also support speed detection devices to improve public safety in school zones and other locations.
- National Transportation Safety Board (NTSB) recommends implementation in every state.
- Insurance Institute for Highway Safety (IIHS) supports use of automated speed enforcement.

Dear Assistant Secretary Thoburn,

The six MPOs of the Sun Coast Transportation Planning Alliance support our Tampa Bay Transportation Management Area Leadership Group's September 23, 2022, letter asking FDOT to engage with Amtrak to improve passenger rail service in West Central Florida. Specifically, we request FDOT undertake a formal assessment of state financial participation in State Supported Amtrak Service under 29 U.S.C. 24712. This action is consistent with the Alliance's regional transit vision of providing transportation alternatives to congested highways, as well as our member MPOs' Long Range Transportation Plans.

FDOT's participation in State Supported Amtrak Service would improve existing passenger rail service and serve as a catalyst for future expansion of the passenger rail network. Currently, there are 17 state departments of transportation that financially support Amtrak passenger rail service across 28 routes nationwide. As the third largest state in the nation, the investment in passenger rail is critical for mitigating congestion and providing transportation options. Additionally, FDOT's participation in State Supported Amtrak Service broadens eligibility to apply for federal grants.

Thank you for your attention to this request. We look forward to assisting FDOT in assessing the State of Florida's participation in State Supported Amtrak Service.
