Commissioner Myers, called the meeting to order at 10:00 AM and led the pledge of allegiance. The meeting was held in person and virtually via WebEx.

III. Approval of Minutes\_ (Timestamp 0:01:30) – February 8, 2023.

Chair Myers sought a motion to approve the February 8, 2023 minutes. Mayor Ross so moved, seconded by Commissioner Wostal; the voice vote passes unanimously.

- **IV. Public Comment on Agenda Items** (*Timestamp 0:01:43*) (30 minutes total, with up to 3 minutes per speaker) Additional comments made via <u>Social Media</u> and <u>Email</u> can be found at the end of these minutes.
  - **Bemetra Simmons** President and CEO of The Tampa Bay Partnership, a coalition of business owners and not-for-profit leaders. Spoke in support of a regional MPO between Pascoe, Pinellas, and Hillsborough Counties. The local conditions are prime for looking at this. Hillsborough County did not pass the transportation referendum, Representative Castor has Hillsborough and Pinellas as part of her Congressional District and the changes of control for both Hillsborough and Pinellas' Commission. The transportation need is great, there is a large population growth, transportation times are increased, and many residents already move between the counties. If the merger were to happen, it would create the largest MPO in the state. It would allow for a unified front for projects and state and federal funds. Noted that FDOT recently completed a study that showed that for every dollar that goes into the state transportation system, five dollars is returned to the state economy. Currently, with the three MPOs, it is difficult to get a consensus on projects and the funding is split. The West Shore Interchange is a good example of moving projects forward

with a unified approach. Encouraged the TPO Board to take a look at the merger of the three MPOs.

### **Discussion:**

It was asked if there is going to be a large enough pool of applicants based on the qualifications. Some of the preferred qualifications were moved from required. It was noted that the timeline may preclude a relocation candidate with children and move it up if possible. The Policy Committee noted that they would like additional overlap as well. On the minimum qualifications, it was noted that candidates may not be part of an MPO or FDOT planning function experience. It was suggested that "other relevant experience" be added to the requirements in order to have a larger pool. It was noted that MPO planning is very specific and that someone with that experience is needed. The suggested language following the five years experience part, the words "or equivalent" be added. It was noted that this position is about leadership and that the MPO or FDOT requirement should be moved to preferred. It was brought up that it would be good to have a member of the CAC on the hiring committee. Mr. Clark noted that all discussions will need to be in the Sunshine; there is no problem with that but the TPO Board needs to have full confidence in the hiring panel. It was decided that there would be public comment allowed during the hiring process.

Suggested that Item B from the Consent Agenda be pulled off the consent agenda. The required qualification bullet point "a minimum requirement of five years of experience at an MPO or an FDOT Planning Function" be moved to preferred qualifications and add "or equivalent".

Commissioner Cohen moved to incorporate the noted changes into the job description and to approve the plan for an Executive Director Search, second by Councilmember Maniscalco. The roll call vote passed 14-0.

**Presentation:** <u>TIP Amendments February 2023</u>

### Discussion:

It was noted that bus stop improvements are often thought to be a City Council item. These improvements are important for ADA but for general improvement. It was brought up that these improvements are desperately needed and are overdue. It was asked if there is a list of the first projects slated or if requests can be put in. Dwayne Brown from HART noted that there is a list of projects, ten are currently in design and those can be provided. Requests can be made and those will be taken into consideration. The priority is safety and also in ADA compliance. It was asked when additional funding can be expected. Each year there is a BTI budget each year; it is broken into separate categories including shelters. Ms. Le Grand stated that there are several priorities that have to be taken into consideration including safety and ADA compliance. In the five-year capital plan, there is funding every year toward this program. This is an ongoing program looking at aging facilities, an uptick in ridership, and stops that will be removed from the system. It was noted that it is going to take an additional \$30 million to really address the challenge of bus stops.

Councilmember Maniscalco moved to approve the TIP Amendments; seconded by Commissioner Kemp. Roll call vote passed 14 - 0.

    - The TMA Leadership Group is a subcommittee of the SCTPA which includes elected officials from the Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas MPO/TPOs

    - Regional long-range transportation plan with needs and affordable projects
    - Regional project prioritization process and ranked order list

    - Regional public involvement plan
    - Annual evaluations of the regional process as a part of the annual MPO/TPO certifications
  - The March 24<sup>th</sup> TMA Leadership Group will discuss regional transportation planning and the preliminary investigation of merging the Hillsborough, Pasco, and Pinellas MPO/TPOs.
    - Looked at the potential timeline.
    - Went over several topics of consideration.
    - Review of a proportional representation scenario.

Presentation: Regional Planning in the Tampa Bay TMA

### Discussion:

There was discussion about how Tampa International Airport, Port Tampa Bay, and THEA have been planning for regional use and have seen a lot of success, use, and growth. Tourism and business are important locally as well as regionally. FDOT has done research on MPOs. They found that the federal government prefers regional MPOs but defers to the state to allow more than one. There are 27 MPOs in Florida, a few that encompass multiple counties and a couple that span state lines. The merging of MPOs can happen when the state dictates or when 75% of the area agrees. When District 7 goes in for funding, they come in county-by-county. If the legislature passes a bill to consolidate, it must be done. It was brought up that funding goes to areas that come in with higher volume and more people. Right now, the counties are competing for grant money, like HART and PST are doing. But there is no regional vision at this time. There was conversation around the makeup of a merged MPO Board and where it would be housed; that it would make sense to have it located in Hillsborough County at County Center. Additional conversations were had around funding that has been promised but not provided and how with a merger the municipalities and non-business centers in the county will not receive priority or funds. There was also concern expressed that the only solutions receiving attention are for bigger and more roads and not other transit options. It was noted that the current model is not working; business is important, but the focus has to be on the residents and smaller projects that make a big impact. The area is getting more crowded and more unsafe yet moving towards a true transit alternative has never been possible. The City of Tampa is looking to have its own option for funding transportation by way of a referendum. There was concern about having county money moved to other governments to fund projects. Mr. Clark clarified that there are 16 members on this Board. Under state law, an MPO is capped at 25 members. There is a lot of flexibility in the membership of Boards including municipalities with populations of more than 50,000. The School Board and Authorities are flexible, they can be on the Board but are not required. Central cities are required to be on the Board. There has been no bill filed at this time.

### **Summary:**

This TIP amendment will impact two projects, noted below:

449852 - 1 Boy Scout Blvd signalization, lighting, signage, and pavement markings 450693 - 1 US 301 signalization, lighting, signage, and pavement markings

The intersection of W Boy Scout Blvd at Manhattan Ave is one of the top safety priorities identified in the TIP priority list. The newly programmed funds will signalize the intersection and stripe it appropriately to allow for safer traffic flow. Traffic signals will offer emergency vehicle preemption to accommodate responses from the nearby fire station. Other improvements include pedestrian crossings, new lighting, and signage.

Three intersections along US 301 – Harney Rd, Stacy Rd, and McIntosh Rd - will be signalized. Additional improvements include new lighting to enhance the safety of bicyclists and pedestrians, and crosswalks to facilitate access to the Fort King Trail.

These projects will not be accelerated into the FY23 TIP but will instead be programmed in FY24. The purpose of this TIP Amendment is to secure federal authorization from FHWA and approve the FY24 funding amount prior to the estimated letting date of the projects, which is tentatively scheduled for November 15, 2023.

Performance Targets for Pavement & Bridge Condition and Travel Time Reliability

### Presenter:

### **Summary:**

Under MAP-21 and FAST Act legislation, the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) requires state DOTs and MPOs to adopt performance targets for pavement and bridge conditions and travel time reliability-related measures every four years.

The *Pavement & Bridge* condition rule from the FHWA became effective on May 20, 2017, and established performance measures to assess the condition of pavements and bridges on the National Highway System (NHS). The rule requires State DOTs and MPOs to set targets related to the percentage of pavements on the Interstate System in both good and poor condition, the percentage of pavements on the Non-Interstate NHS system in both good and poor condition, and the percentage of NHS bridges in both good and poor condition.

On December 16, 2022, FDOT established the following 2025 targets for which TPO staff is recommending that we support:

- Interstate NHS Pavements: ≥60% in Good condition
- Interstate NHS Pavements: ≤5% in Poor condition
- Non-interstate NHS Pavements: ≥40% in Good condition
- Non-interstate NHS Pavements: ≤5% in Poor condition
- NHS Bridges: ≥50% in Good condition
- NHS Bridges: ≤10% in Poor condition

The System Performance rule from the FHWA became effective on May 20, 2017. This rule establishes performance measures to assess the travel time reliability on the NHS. Specifically, the rule requires DOTs and MPOs to set targets related to the percentage of the Interstate network considered reliable for vehicles, the percentage of non-Interstate NHS considered reliable for vehicles, and the percentage of the Interstate network deemed reliable for freight.

On December 16, 2022, FDOT established statewide targets for these measures. While the Hillsborough TPO supports the statewide goal of improving travel time reliability, staff is recommending the TPO to establish the following targets based on existing levels of investment in congestion mitigation projects and forecasts of future traffic conditions:

- Interstate Level of Travel Time Reliability: ≥65.6%
- Non-Interstate NHS Level of Travel Time Reliability: ≥90.1%
- Interstate NHS Truck Travel Time Reliability Index Score: ≤1.94

The TPO Board prioritizes projects for funding, including those identified in the State of Good Repair and Smart Cities categories, which may improve the condition of pavements and bridges, and system reliability. By approving the recommended action, the TPO will commit to continue prioritizing projects in the Transportation Improvement Program that can make progress toward achieving the aforementioned performance targets.

Dear Mike,

On April 12, 2023, the Hillsborough Transportation Planning Organization established performance targets for the Pavement & Bridge Condition and System Performance Rules to comply with the requirements of the MAP-21 and FAST Act.

The Hillsborough TPO agreed to support FDOT's statewide pavement & bridge condition targets, while electing to set its own system performance targets for travel time reliability, as indicated below:

- ≥65.6% Interstate Travel Time Reliability
- ≥90.1% Non-interstate NHS Travel Time Reliability
- ≤1.94Truck Travel Time Reliability Index

With this action, the TPO is agreeing to plan and program projects in the Transportation Improvement Program that will, once implemented, make progress toward achieving the adopted targets.

We support the efforts of FDOT to implement performance-based planning and programming. We believe that these measures provide a uniform calculus by which to identify both strengths and weaknesses of the national transportation system, to increase accountability and transparency of the Federal-Aid Highway Program, and to improve decision-making through performance-based planning and programming.

In recognition of the exemplary efforts made by FDOT District 7 to maintain NHS pavements & bridges in a condition which exceeds the statewide target, we write to request that our District 7 partners continue to maintain these vital assets in a good state of repair. We also request that funding be made available in the FDOT Work Program to support operational and other improvements which may alleviate bottlenecks and improve travel time reliability on the National Highway System. A number of projects which could make a difference, and which are ready for funding

and implementation, are identified on the Hillsborough TPO's Transportation Improvement Program priority list, which is attached for reference.

Whereas, the Hillsborough Transportation Planning Organization (TPO), the Pasco County TPO and Forward Pinellas (the "Parties") collectively desire to create a Tampa Bay Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) to improve regional transportation planning and define regional transportation priorities by entering into the Memorandum of Understanding (MOU);

**Whereas**, the Tampa Bay metropolitan area of Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough County has a combined population of 3.5 million and is projected to grow by more than one million people over the next 20 years;

**Whereas**, the Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough County MPOs or TPOs all function within the single Tampa-St. Petersburg Urban Area that covers much of the population within all three counties;

Whereas, since 1990 the State of Florida has requested that the three MPOs in the urban area consolidate into a single MPO unless they can sufficiently justify why they need to remain separate due to their complexity, unique conditions, and diversity within the region while also fostering a strong cooperative regional transportation planning process that addresses shared data, identifying regional needs, coordinated project development, and establishment of regional transportation priorities;

Whereas, the West Central Florida Chairs Coordinating Committee is established in state statutes (now Sun Coast Transportation Planning Alliance or SCTPA) and has interlocal agreements among the six MPOs serving the broader West Central Florida region and a subcommittee known as the Tampa Bay Transportation Management Area Leadership Group (TMA LG) serving the Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough MPOs that establish such a regional coordination and prioritization process;

Whereas, the pending sunset of the Tampa Bay Area Regional Transit Authority (TBARTA) will leave a void in regional transportation planning and project development, without dedicated staff and a governing board assigned to advance regional transportation activities and priorities;

Whereas, the process for forming a new regional MPO involved a number of steps to create required establishing planning documents as well as changing the hosting arrangements and MPO boundaries. As there is little precedent in Florida to rely on for guidance regarding de-designating an MPO, it will be important from a federal transportation funding cashflow to have a new MPO fully up and running at such time as existing MPOs are de-designated;

**Whereas**, MPOs receive federal planning funds through quarterly reimbursement that come with federal and state restrictions on how those funds may be used, there will need to be a substantial and long-term local commitment to provide sustainable and flexible funding for a regional MPO to be effective;

Whereas, the Florida Department of Transportation has committed through its approved Planning Funds (PL) distribution formula in 2014 that any MPOs in Florida that merge will continue to receive the base amount of PL due to each MPO prior to the merger.

NOW, THEREFORE, IN RECOGNITION OF THE FOREGOING, the involved MPOs hereby jointly understand, agree and commit as follows:

### **ARTICLE 1. PURPOSE**

The purpose of this MOU is to document the mutual understanding between the Parties and to set forth the terms for their cooperation.

### **ARTICLE 2. AGREEMENTS AND OBLIGATIONS OF THE PARTIES**

- A. The Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough County MPOs agree to investigate the formation, organizational and governance structure of a new regional MPO to serve the urban area of Pasco, Pinellas and Hillsborough Counties as reflected by the 2020 Census, with the goal of certifying the MPO by July 1, 2027. Other key steps toward formation may occur sooner than that date.
- B. A regional MPO serving these counties will augment and enhance the current functions of the existing MPOs in the urban area as currently represented by the Pasco MPO, Forward Pinellas and the Hillsborough TPO. It is important that while a regional MPO may provide a stronger and more collaborative regional focus and planning process that at the same time the existing long range transportation planning responsibilities be maintained at the county level for sub-regional, jurisdiction focused projects to avoid creating a local void in planning and technical assistance activities.
- C. A regional MPO must reflect proportional representation on its governing board based on the population of local governments within the MPO planning boundary, consistent with Florida Statutes that place requirements on the total number of voting members and the percentage that must represent the respective Boards of County Commissioners.
- D. The governance structure of a regional MPO may include representatives of transportation agencies as voting members, but their inclusion will reduce the number of local government elected officials as voting members on the governing board.
- E. Outreach to all local governments in the Metropolitan Planning Area is an important step in the regional MPO formation process and individual MPOs will develop a coordinated presentation and engagement strategy to fully inform and seek input from all affected local governments.

- F. The formation and certification of a new regional MPO will require the creation and adoption of multiple planning, development and policy documents for the region that are consistent with federal and state laws and regulations, including:
  - a. Apportionment Plan that describes to voting representation of the MPO's regional planning boundary and member local governments
  - b. Unified Planning Work Program (a two-year budget of planning activities)
  - c. Long Range Transportation Plan (20-25 year financially feasible plan for transportation)
  - d. Public Participation Plan (how it will involve the public in decision-making)
  - e. Transportation Improvement Program (a five-year work plan for transportation projects with funding by phase)
  - f. Congestion Management Process (a strategic means of evaluating the causes and strategies for improving traffic congestion)
  - g. Title VI process and Continuity of Operations Plan (addressing ADA complaints and emergency operations)
  - h. Interlocal agreements and/or staff services agreements with one or more host agencies (if the MPO is not fully independent), and interlocal agreements to receive funding and provide planning services to any number of local governments in the region.
- G. Those planning products shall reflect the work of the individual MPOs currently in place but will need to be substantially revised and restructured to reflect the new planning boundaries of the MPO as a truly regional entity covering the tri-county urban area.
- H. The MPOs in their current formation have demonstrated competent leadership and effectiveness in planning for countywide and local transportation needs and priorities in their respective planning areas, building trust and collaborative partnerships with local community stakeholders and land use planning agencies that will need to be sustained with the formation of a regional MPO. Therefore, the regional MPO will consider staff services agreements with the planning agency in each county to support outreach and engagement as well as coordination on land use, transportation operations and safety.
- I. As each existing MPO is currently hosted by another agency, the impacts to those agencies and their staffs should be considered; the interlocal agreements with those organizations will need to be updated. Those existing host agencies may present an opportunity for continuing long range transportation planning at a county or jurisdictional level.
- J. There will be substantial start-up costs to form a regional MPO based on case study examples elsewhere in the United States requiring funding to hire staff, secure office space, purchase equipment and produce necessary planning products and administrative documents.
- K. A regional MPO will need a recurring local funding source from member agencies or the host local government to develop a budget pay for staff salaries, planning activities, facilities and other related administration costs to augment federal and state funds that are paid on a quarterly reimbursement.

L. To retain and continue to attract quality staff for transportation planning through what may be a multi-year transition period, existing staff at the time of formation of a regional MPO will be offered positions with the new MPO and with their county governments/planning agencies.

### **ARTICLE 3. TERM**

The term of this MOU shall commence on the date the last signature is obtained ("Effective Date") and shall continue in effect until one or more parties terminates the MOU or a new MPO interlocal agreement is in place.

### **ARTICLE 4. TERMINATION**

This MOU may be terminated upon written agreement by the Parties with a 30-day notice.

### **ARTICLE 5. AMENDMENTS**

This MOU may be amended, in writing, at any time if the Parties agree.

### Timeline for Executive Recruitment

### Now-March 7

Draft timeline, job description, determine salary range, & create list of places to advertise.

### March 8

HR Manager presents timeline & job description at the regular meeting of the TPO Policy Committee, for review and recommendation to TPO Board. TPO Board approval is sought, and an odd number of volunteers solicited to serve with the Policy Committee as the semifinalist interview panel.

### March 13-May 12

Staff advertises the opening for up to two 30-day periods, accepts resumes, prepares and distributes a brochure, and places ads in social media and with professional associations. Placeholder dates are scheduled for the semifinalist interviews.

### May 15-19

HR Manager reviews resumes against qualifications & conducts brief phone conversations to confirm receipt of applications.

### May 22

Qualifying resumes are distributed to all TPO Board members, grouped into whether they meet the minimum or preferred qualifications, along with a survey for the members to rate the candidates. The survey questions are based on the position description.

### June 9

Deadline for TPO Board members to return surveys rating the candidates, to the HR Manager.

### June 14

HR Manager presents survey results at TPO Board meeting and recommends 4-6 semi-finalists to be interviewed, based on the survey. TPO Board is asked to approve the list of semi-finalists.

### June 19-June 23

HR Manager circulates a draft list of interview questions to the panelists and solicits suggestions to be sent individually. At the week's end, HR Manager compiles the suggestions and sends a consolidated list of questions to the panel.

### June 26-June 30 and July 10-July 28

Semifinalist interviews are conducted virtually, during new, specially scheduled virtual meetings of the Policy Committee on two days. These are advertised as workshops with no action and will take 4-6 hours all together. They will begin with the HR Manager reading the questions agreed on in advance by the interview panel but leave room for panelist follow-up questions.

### August 9

The Policy Committee meets at its regular time to discuss the interviews, making a recommendation to the TPO Board of 2-3 finalists to interview in person. Any other members of the interview panel are asked to attend and participate in the committee discussion. Selection of the finalists is made by the TPO Board following a report from the Policy Committee Chair.

### August 10-August 25

Travel arrangements are made as needed. Background and social media checks are conducted.

### September 12

Finalists tour office.

### September 13

TPO Board interviews finalists, votes on a ranking, and authorizes Chair and/or Vice Chair to negotiate salary, start date and provide direction for the Planning Commission Executive Director to administer the hiring action.

### Mid-late October

Candidate's start date.

### November 3

Beth retires.



#### **TERMS**

Applicant is any person, group, railroad, governmental entity or neighborhood association.

**Application** is a Railroad Grade Crossing Application Form 725-090-66 to open or close a public at-grade crossing.

**Public railroad-highway grade crossing** is a location at which a railroad track is crossed at grade by a public road.

**Stipulation of Parties** is a voluntary agreement between FDOT, a railroad, a governmental entity and other parties. The stipulation establishes the responsibilities and actions of each party and permits the opening or closure.

**Notice of Intent** is FDOT's recommendation to permit or deny the applicant's request. It is based upon an analysis of the request and Rule 14-57.012, Florida Administrative Code criteria, impacts and relevant facts.

**Administrative Hearing** is a hearing based on Section 120, Florida Statutes, in which an administrative law judge hears testimony and argument on all issues involved.

**Recommended Order** is entered by the administrative law judge, following the hearing, which supports or denies the opening or closure.

**Final Order** is issued by the FDOT Secretary. It may be an adoption of the Recommended Order or may overrule the order, authorizing or denying the applicant's request.

**Department-Owned Active Rail Corridor** means

a Department-owned lineal property acquired from a railroad that is operational for the use of rail transportation, such as the South Florida Rail Corridor (Tri-Rail) and the Central Florida Rail Corridor (SunRail). To enhance transportation facilities and services, and protect the safety of the traveling public, the Department prohibits all new at-grade rail crossings on Department-owned active rail corridors.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has regulatory authority over all public railroad-highway grade crossings in the state, including the authority to issue permits which shall be required prior to the opening and closing of such crossings.

(based on 335.141, Florida Statutes)



#### **FACTS**

## Applications for a public rail grade crossing opening can only be submitted by:

- A government body entity that has jurisdiction over the public street or highway.
- Railroads operating trains through the crossing

## Applications for a public rail grade crossing closure can only be submitted by:

- Jurisdictional governments
- Railroads
- Individuals or neighborhood organizations that may be impacted by the closure

## In considering an application for a crossing permit, the following criteria will apply:

- Safety
- Necessity for rail and vehicle traffic
- Alternate routes
- Effect on rail operations and expenses
- Closure of one or more public railroad-highway crossing to offset opening a new crossing
- Design of the grade crossing and road approaches
- Presence of multiple tracks and their effect upon railroad and highway operations
- When the estimated highway traffic is 30,000 vehicles or more a day across main line tracks, an engineering and benefit-cost analysis must be performed by the applicant to determine if a grade separation is warranted

#### Costs:

The expense of crossing closures or openings will be the responsibility of the applicant, unless otherwise negotiated and accepted by all parties.

#### **Rail Corridor Crossing Permits:**

New rail corridor crossing permits for public or private roadways are prohibited on active rail corridors. The issuance of a rail corridor crossing permit on a Department-owned inactive rail corridor does not create a property right or vested interest in a rail corridor crossing and such permit is revocable in accordance with the provisions of Rule Chapter 14-57. Potential applicants are encouraged to contact the Department Central Rail Office to inquire as to the feasibility of a proposed rail corridor crossing before submitting an application.

#### STEPS After Submitting Application:

- FDOT reviews the application to ensure that all necessary information is provided and the crossing is a public, at-grade rail crossing.
- FDOT acknowledges receipt and seeks a response to the application from all affected parties.
- If the application meets Rule 14-57.012, Florida Administrative Code criteria, and is agreed upon by all parties, FDOT will draft a Stipulation of Parties. This agreement outlines each party's responsibilities. The execution of the Stipulation of Parties serves as a Final Order and permit to open or close the crossing.
- Following the execution of the Stipulation of Parties, a Crossing Inventory Form is submitted to the Federal Railroad Administration and crossing data is entered into the FDOT Railroad Highway Crossing Inventory.
- If the parties cannot agree through a Stipulation of Parties, FDOT will issue a Notice of Intent to permit or deny the opening or closure of the crossing.
- The Notice of Administrative Hearing Rights is submitted to all parties with the Notice of Intent, allowing 21 days in which to request an administrative hearing.
- Acceptance of the Notice of Intent by all parties, or failure to file a request for a hearing in accordance with Chapter 120.57, Florida Statues, by the petitioning party will result in the execution and distribution of a Final Order by FDOT.
- If an administrative hearing is requested within 21 days, FDOT will refer the petition to the Division of Administrative Hearings for scheduling.
- An Administrative Law Judge conducts a hearing and issues a Recommended Order.
- A Final Order is then executed by the FDOT Secretary.
- Following completion of the opening or closure, the Freight and Rail Office (FRO) will inspect the site for compliance with Department's standards.
- Following project completion, a US DOT Crossing Inventory Form is created by the FRO a nd submitted to the Federal Railroad Administration. Crossing data is entered into the Department \*RHCI by FRO and the District Rail Coordinator is notified of an update.

Subject: Legislative Bill Tracker

Good morning, MPOAC Governing Board members and Staff Directors. Attached is the latest Legislative Bill Tracker and Member Projects list. The highlighted bills are those that touch upon our business in some fashion and on which we focus our attention. The Senate and Appropriations bills were introduced and, for the Department of Transportation, both bills are very similar. The Senate bill, SB 2500, appropriates \$14.779 to FDOT. The House bill, APC1, appropriates \$14.792. Both are slightly more than the Governor's recommendation. The status of the Department's Transportation bill, SB 1250/HB1305, did not change this past week. Below is a summary of what is in the Department's bill this year.

- Adds rating agency services to the list of contractual services and commodities not subject to certain competitive solicitation requirements.
- Provides that the prohibition against use of bond proceeds for acquisition of any building or facility that will be, during the pendency of financing, used by, occupied by, leased to, or paid for by any state, county or municipal agency or entity does not prohibit the use of proceeds from Florida Development Finance Corporation private activity bonds to finance acquisition or construction of a transportation facility under a public-private partnership.
- Authorizes the Florida Development Finance Corporation to issue revenue bonds to finance the costs of acquisition or construction of a transportation facility by a private entity or a consortium of private entities under a specified public-private partnership.
- Authorizes the FDOT to fund up to 100 percent of project costs for eligible intermodal logistics center projects in rural areas of opportunity.
- Authorizes the FDOT, subject to availability of appropriate funds, and unless otherwise provided in the General Appropriations Act or the Implementing bill, to fund certain projects at a publicly owned, publicly operated airport located in a rural community which does not have any scheduled commercial service.
- Requires the FDOT's rules governing public airport site approval to include a requirement that an applicant provide a copy of a written memorandum of understanding or letter of agreement regarding air traffic pattern separation procedures between the parties representing a proposed airport and any existing airport or any approved airport site located within three miles of the proposed site, signed by each of the respective parties, but only if required by a final Federal Aviation Administration airspace determination letter or deemed necessary by the FDOT.
- Authorizes installation, as specified, of automated license plate recognition systems within the rights-of-way of the State Highway System at the discretion of the FDOT when installed at the request of a law enforcement agency for the purpose of collecting active criminal intelligence or investigative information.
- Authorizes the FDOT to purchase promotional items for the promotion of electric vehicle use and charging stations, autonomous vehicles, and context design for electric vehicles and autonomous vehicles.
- Authorizes the FDOT to expend funds, within its discretion, for training, testing, and licensing for full-time employees of the FDOT who are required to have a valid Class A or Class B commercial driver license as a condition of employment with the FDOT.
- Increases from \$250K to \$500K the cap on entering into contracts for construction and maintenance without advertising and receiving competitive bids for reasons of public concern, economy, improved operations, or safety, and only when circumstances dictate rapid completion of the work.

- Removes the expiration date of a provision allowing the chair and vice chair of the Legislative Budget Commission to authorize an FDOT work program amendment if the Commission does not meet or consider the amendment within 30 days after its submittal.
- Requires that public transit development plans of eligible providers of public transit block grants be consistent, to the maximum extent feasible, with the long-range transportation plans of the metropolitan planning organization in which the provider is located.
- Removes from annual public transit provider reports a requirement to specifically address potential enhancements to productivity and performance that would have the effect of increasing farebox recovery ratio; and requires each public transit provider to publish on its website, rather than in the local newspaper, the productivity and performance measures established for the year and a report on attainment of such measures.
- Repeals part IV of Chapter 348, F.S., relating to the creation and operation of the Santa Rosa Bay Bridge Authority; transfers governance and control of the Authority and its bridge system and any remaining assets and rights to the FDOT; authorizes the FDOT to assume legal liability for contractual obligations determined to be necessary and authorizes transfer of the bridge system to the Turnpike.

As far as member projects, the Senate is up to \$898.4 million. The House total is up to \$1.355 billion. There are 222 projects in the proposal. Last year member projects were funded with General Revenue. We'll have to wait towards the end of Session to see how, or if, they will be funded this year.

Draft legislation that would merge the three MPOs in the Tampa Bay area has not moved. It's too late in the process to propose a new bill, but the language could be tacked on to an existing bill. The word on the street is that the issue is on hold for this Session.

To Whom It May Concern:

On behalf of the Hillsborough TPO, I am pleased to support Port Tampa Bay's **Southbay Road and Utilities** project in Hillsborough County, Florida, as a Community Funding project (under the PIDP or Port Infrastructure Development category).

The Southbay project is an expansion of Port Redwing, Port Tampa Bay's newest terminal, the area around which is building out quickly. Southbay is the second phase, the upland area, suitable for large footprint manufacturing, DCs and transload operations, and other ancillary industries. Port Tampa Bay intends to construct, on its property, a 3,300-linear-foot two-lane roadway and utilities including water, storm and sanitary, lighting, power, fencing.

The current market for port-adjacent warehousing is strong, and this \$6 million project will leverage private investment. When Southbay is fully built out, it is expected to generate in excess of 876 permanent well-paying jobs, with total earnings of more than \$55 million. About 293 will be jobs directly related to port businesses. The project is in and will support a census tract that is an area of persistent poverty. Each year, business services revenue will exceed \$58 million, \$32.8 million of local purchases will be made, and almost \$5.5 million in local and state taxes are forecast to be paid.

Port Tampa Bay is Florida's largest port in tonnage and area, and its location right next to one of the fastest growing populations in the US, Tampa Bay, makes its expansion doubly important. Using a port as close as possible to the cargo origin or destination helps reduce truck miles on Florida's overburdened highways, versus using a more distant port. As a result, this project contributes to a better environment. Fewer truck miles travelled will cut emissions, enhance roadway safety, and enhance economic benefits. This benefits the Tampa Bay region, the state and the nation.

Further, Port Tampa Bay is an economic engine of this region, and is an anchor of the Central Florida Mega-region's cluster of logistics-led businesses along the I-4 corridor-comprising 200 square miles of such businesses. Our TPO's *Hillsborough + Polk Freight Logistics Zone Strategic Plan* documents the significance of this business cluster to the state's economy as well as to our residents' access to living-wage jobs. Thus, strategic investments in transportation facilities supporting Port Tampa Bay will have broad and far-reaching benefits for prosperity.

RE: Update on Vacant Structures Owned by FDOT in VM Ybor

As a continuing effort to keep our partners apprised of property management and acquisition activities undertaken by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), I am providing an update on FDOT-owned vacant structures in the vicinity of the VM Ybor neighborhood. The FDOT has had contracts to sell/relocate two vacant structures several times over the past few years. In October 2022, a contract was awarded for the relocation of 1306 E. 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue. 2506 N Avenida Republica de Cuba (14<sup>th</sup> Street) was sold in December 2022.

As a part of the Downtown Tampa Interchange (I-275/I-4) Safety and Operational Improvements, the six parcels required in VM Ybor have been acquired by FDOT. Below is an update on each parcel:

**914 East 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue** – The structure was advertised for sale and relocation in September 2022. No bids were received. The historic structure was documented, and historic materials salvaged. There was a fire to the structure on March 4, 2023 that caused substantial damage. Demolition will begin today.

**702 East Columbus Drive** – The structure was advertised for sale and relocation in October 2022. No bids were received. Documentation was completed, historic materials salvaged and asbestos was removed. We anticipate demolition to begin the week of March 27, 2023.

**1005** East 14<sup>th</sup> Avenue, 1011 East 14th Avenue, 1013 East 14th Avenue, and 2502 North 12<sup>th</sup> Street – All four of these structures are in final stages of their historic documentation and were advertised for sale and relocation beginning March 1, 2023. A mandatory pre-bid was held on March 15, 2023. There were no bids received on March 22, 2023. Demolition of these four structures is anticipated to occur within the year following standard documentation procedures.
